

Dear Saints:

Since the Lord's Table was established in Dublin, Ireland in 2005, the Church has been meeting in homes or in rented facilities. This was acceptable for a time because costs were reasonable and space was adequate. However, in recent years, prices have increased substantially and our numbers have grown. As a result, the time has come for a suitable meeting hall.

Dublin is listed as one of nine target European localities for strengthening with strategic importance in the Recovery as the only English speaking capital in the EU. A good meeting place will help establish the Church for spreading in the country.

For well over a year, we have been looking at properties. However, Dublin is a strong "seller's market" and agents require a "proof of purchase" up front; meaning evidence that we already have the funds to complete the transaction. This is in the form of a bank statement or letter from a solicitor verifying that funds are already on hand. These funds must be available *at the time of agreement*. In effect, this requirement prevents us from moving forward because currently we do not have sufficient funds.

Due to this limitation, we are presenting this need to the Recovery, asking the saints and the churches to consider giving to a "trust fund" so that we may build up the necessary cash reserve to complete a purchase. If an adequate amount is built up we can proceed to view properties and provide the necessary assurance to the Seller that we have the funds. In this market, we estimate about 2 million euro would provide good options for purchase, with any needed renovations.
